

JOB VACANCY - PRODUCTION OPERATOR

Job purpose: To ensure safe, effective and efficient operation of the production processes and adherence to procedures.

Location: Salford

Job type: Full time, fixed term (12 months)

Contracted hours: Average 43.75 hours per week on a 4 week rotating shift pattern:

- Week 1: Monday, Tuesday, Saturday and Sunday 06:00 -18:30
- Week 2: Wednesday, Thursday and Friday 06:00 - 18:30
- Week 3: Monday, Tuesday, Saturday and Sunday 18:00 - 06:30
- Week 4: Wednesday, Thursday and Friday 18:00 - 06:30

Principle duties:

- Ensure safe working practices at all times, all jobs must be carried out according to the Safe Operating Procedures (SOPs)
- Run the Salford plant and report throughput weights for each area, and each shift.
- Ensure housekeeping is maintained to a high standard
- Ensure the throughputs are logged on the paperwork and reasons for any downtime or through put problems are logged accordingly
- Ensure all product weights and other paperwork is filled in each shift correctly including FLT checks, testing sheets and maintenance checks
- Carry out FLT checks on each shift and log any faults with truck
- Report any safety concerns seen on the plant and raise a safety concern so it is addressed accordingly
- Be flexible and work in any area of the production plant needed when requested by management.

- 1 year extrusion experience preferred
- Fork Lift Truck licence preferred
- Positive, can do attitude and self-motivated
- Well organised and works well under pressure
